# Sunflowers: Seeds to Consumers

The Friends of the Pennsylvania Farm Show Foundation, Inc., in partnership with Dieffenbach's, Keystone Farm Future, Penn State Extension and Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture produced a brand new exhibit for Farm Show attendees this year.

The Sunflowers: Seeds to Consumers display, whose main focus was to teach about how sunflowers are being grown and used in the Keystone State, included a variety of areas for Farm Show goers to explore. A main attraction was the two photo booth opportunities that included sunflower backdrops with an Uglies® Kettle Chip sample afterwards.

Dieffenbach's uses sunflower oil to create the distinct flavor of the Uglies® Kettle Chip. Their team created a mock-up of the potato chip process from start to finish. Dieffenbach's handed out 21,760 one-ounce samples for a total of 1,360 pounds of potato chips!

Greg Roth, a Professor Emeritus of Agronomy from Penn State, had a working sunflower press on display to show how sunflowers go from seed to meal and oil.

Keystone Farm Future supplied life-size steers, which showed the importance of sunflower meal to livestock.

#### 2023 Pennsylvania Fair Queen Crowned

Lebanon Area Fair Queen Chloe Bomgardner of Lebanon County was crowned the 2023 Pennsylvania Fair Queen on Saturday, January 21 at the 110th annual convention of the Pennsylvania State Association of County Fairs (PSACF) and Pennsylvania State Showmen's Association.

58 contestants were evaluated by a panel of three judges on their written and speaking skills, knowledge of the fair and agriculture industries, and their poise and personal presentation in business attire.

Chloe is the daughter of Corwin and Tara Bomgardner. Agriculture and the Lebanon Area Fair have always been an important part of her life. She assists her family with raising holstein show heifers, dairy beef, chickens and market hogs. She is an active member of the Northern Lebanon FFA Chapter, serving as vice president. She is also a current president of the NorLebCo 4-H Dairy Club. Chloe enjoys participating in the Lebanon Area Fair by showing her animals and volunteering in fair food

York State Fair Queen Sarah Rehmeyer, 18, of York County was selected as 2023 Alternate. The daughter of William and Lisa Rehmeyer, Sarah's ag experience started at age 6 as a member of the York County 4-H Goat Club and continued as a member of FFA during high school. She has volunteered with various 4-H and STEM events as well as the York County Birthing Center. She is currently attending college studying Analytical Chemistry.

Other top five finalists were New Holland Farmers Fair Queen Kendell Moats; Fayette County Fair Queen Isabel Poorbaugh; and Huntingdon County Fair Queen Evangeline McGargle, Abigail Jerome of Luzerne County was chosen as Miss Congeniality by her fellow contestants.

Chloe and Sarah will each receive a scholarship from the PSACF at the end of their reigns in January 2024. Chloe was crowned by outgoing Pennsylvania Fair Queen Anna Haldeman of the Manheim Community Farm Show, and Sarah was crowned by outgoing Alternate Rebecca Williamson of the American Legion County Fair.

Chloe, the 37th state queen, will travel the state this year representing Pennsylvania's rich agricultural heritage and serving as an ambassador for the PSACF and the PA Department of Agriculture.
