

FOFS, Inc. Honors Two of its Charter Members

The Friends of the Pennsylvania Farm Show Foundation, Inc., was established in August 2010 as a way to stimulate, facilitate and support educational programs, incentives and events relating to the annual Pennsylvania Farm Show. Since then, the foundation has grown to be more than any of the original core members ever dreamed.

On April 30, the board was honored to acknowledge two of its charter members, Beverly Gruber and Marvin Bashore.

Beverly has served on the Friends' board as secretary and treasurer since its start as well as marketing coordinator and newsletter editor for six years. Marvin served as the Friends' attorney until his recent retirement. Board members, along with Farm Show staff, gathered to congratulate Beverly and Marvin on their irreplaceable service and gifts to the Friends of the Pennsylvania Foundation, Inc.

Honoring Beverly Gruber

If you attend the Farm Show, you have most likely had the chance to meet Beverly. Her enthusiasm and love for agriculture has allowed her to be involved in many aspects of the Farm Show since 1953. She has been a competitor, a 4-Her, an advisor to Future Homemakers of America (FHA) demonstration teams, Farm Show commis-

sioner from 1997 to 2004, volunteer in the Family Living Area, coordinator for the first Apple Pie Contest and the Hershey Contest (PSACF), instrumental in the introduction of the Wine Competition, canned goods judge, the Farm Products Coordinator from 2005 to 2022, instrumental in securing space for the merry-go-round (which benefits the Pennsylvania Farm Show Scholarship Foundation and the Pennsylvania Showmen's Association Scholarships.), involvement with many exhibits, and received the 2006 Farm Show Service Award in 2006.

Farm Show quickly became the highlight of her year from the first time she entered a competitive event. Her broomstick skirt won 10th place, and she realized competing was her passion. When asked what her favorite event of the Farm Show was,

she replied, "A while back when they had Polka Day. It brought in a brand new visitor who really enjoyed the Farm Show, and they came to visit by busloads. I love Polka music because it is so happy. All you see are smiles when the music is playing. As for present day Farm Show, I really enjoy the Bid Calling Contest on Wednesday evening. The chant of the contestants is inspiring and fun." Beverly believes that the visitors to the Farm Show should be educated about agriculture and the Foundation is the perfect answer in reaching this goal. Even from the start of the Foundation, she was confident it would succeed, however, she never believed that since its formation, it would raise \$1.8 million. To her, it proves, "Farm Show ranks high on everyone's

Congratulations Marvin Bashore

Marvin Bashore Esq., is no stranger to the Farm Show. He exhibited at the Farm Show during his 4-H years with his Holstein dairy cows. He showed his first project heifer during the 1960 show where he took first place in the 4-H Senior Yearling class and third place in the Open class. He continued to show until 1966.

So, when he was contacted by Brook Duer, then Chief Council for the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, to work with them and Farm Show staff to form a foundation or other legal mechanism to facilitate support for the various Farm Show programs, he immediately agreed. Marvin believed the project would be an interesting opportunity to support the Farm Show.

Marvin served as legal counsel to the Foundation from its formation in 2010 until April 2023, upon his retirement. With his expertise, he was able to develop the Foundation bylaws and articles of incorporation.

Marvin had the absolute expertise to identify and to facilitate the right structure to create our successful non-profit.

When asked what prompted him to serve with the Friends, he replied, "My legal career emphasized representing and serving the agriculture community, in particular dairy farmers and their cooperatives in the field of milk marketing regulations. Being involved with the Friends and being able to support the Farm Show and the diverse areas of agriculture in Pennsylvania which it serves and promotes was a natural interest and a wonderful opportunity for me."

It was hard to envision how successful the Foundation would become at its beginning. Marvin, along with others, were optimistic, but also guarded as "the Foundation was carving out a bit of a new role as a supporting conduit between the Commonwealth and the private sector." However, as time moved forward, the Foundation has become extremely successful. Marvin has been honored to watch the non-profit grow since its inception. He has witnessed dedicated board members direct the Foundation and grow the non-profit to what it is today. Marvin has also seen how the Farm Show staff has been supportive while recognizing the Foundation's role as an independent entity.

Shapiro Administration Urban Ag Tour Wraps: Feeding Community Strength Through Agriculture

Grant Applications Now Open for \$700,000 to Grow Opportunities Statewide

Harrisburg, PA – Agriculture Secretary Russell Redding concluded a weeklong annual tour of diverse projects across Pennsylvania, where locals are working together to feed community strength and fuel economic progress through agriculture.

"It's a beautiful thing to meet inspirational people who are changing the public perception of what agriculture is," Secretary Redding said. "At every stop we have seen a labor of love by devoted, passionate Pennsylvanians who are uniting neighbors who may not share anything but the common denominator of food.

Urban agriculture is feeding
Pennsylvania's future, whether it's
helping young people find
inspiration and learning life skills,
selling cut flowers to fund free
food boxes for low-income
neighbors, putting cutting-edge
science and technology to work to
reduce food waste and grow
healthier food, or providing
familiar food and community
connection to new Americans
making their home in an
unfamiliar place."

At Fresh Food Farms in York. Governor Josh Shapiro joined the tour to announce The GIANT Company's commitment of \$200,000 to support 2023-24 PA Farm Bill Urban Agriculture Infrastructure Grants. The partnership boosts total funding too \$700.000 for the state's program aimed at increasing fresh food acess in urban food deserts, addressing historical inequities, and feeding community opportunities to thrive together. From formerly incarcerated women learning to grow food

year-round in a retrofitted freight container, to children with disabilities learning life and job skills with expertly adapted tools, to public school agriculture career and technology students learning to grow produce in soil-less systems using hemp by-products, the tour introduced local and state legislators, educational and economic development officials to projects supported by state investments multiplied by private and corporate partnerships.

Pennsylvania has invested more than \$2 million in urban agriculture through the program since 2019. That \$2 million investment has leveraged \$2 million more in local matching dollars. In total, 113 projects in 19 counties across the state are expanding fresh food access in locations often served by a single convenience store.

Applications opened Monday, July 17 for 2023-24 Urban Agriculture Infrastructure Grants. Eligible projects will improve or create programs, sharing resources or pooling agricultural products to build a neighborhood's access to fresh, local food. Individuals, businesses, community and agricultural organizations in urban communities may apply for either individual "microgrants" or collaborative grants for partnership projects.

Grant applications must be submitted online through the PA Department of Community and Economic Development Electronic Single Application. Applications opened Monday, July 17, and are due at 5:00 PM on Sept. 1, 2023.

Full grant guidelines are published in the July 15 edition of the PA Bulletin at agriculture.pa.gov.

Broad Street Market's Devastating Fire is Uniting the Community.

There was sadness in the air when news spread of the 2 alarm fire at the Broad Market in Harrisburg on Monday, July 10, 2023. The market consists of two buildings and it was the brick building that was engulfed in flames. Watching the newsreel on TV of the fire was heart-wrenching. The Broad Street Market is an agriculture hub in the city and is home to multiple small businesses. There are so many people in the community who rely on shopping there.

The 163-year-old market is the oldest operating farmers' market in the Nation dating back to 1860. When the market started, at that time it was on the outskirts of Harrisburg. As the city grew, it encompassed the market.

The market consists of two buildings; the stone building was completed in 1863. The red brick building was built somewhere between 1874 to 1878.

During the Civil War, the market fed soldiers at Camp Curtain. In the early 1920s, the market was at its peak with over 700 vendors selling their products and wares. There used to be a wooden extension built between the buildings and at some point in the 1960s it was torn down. During that time in the 1960s, there were about 300 vendors active at the market. In 1974 the market received the designation to be placed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Present day the Broad Street Market is a hub of activity, offering produce, meats, cheeses, and baked goods along with vendors selling products. It has such an inviting atmosphere and it is commonplace to buy your meal and sit around the stone walkway to listen to musicians.

The brick building has extensive damage but local officials have committed to rebuilding the market. Governor Shapiro also expressed support. Officials estimate that it will be a 2 to 3-year timeframe for the rebuild to be completed.

The community is supporting the market by showing up to continue to shop. It was shared in the news.
