# Stories in Stone: Discover the Artifact in the Cameron Street Lobby



Contractors removing crumbling original panels above arena entrance.

The Large Arena, built in 1938 for \$1,250,000 and opened for the 23rd Farm Show which, reportedly drew an estimated 110,000 visitors — though attendance figures from the 1930s and early 1940s were often inflated.

Its roof is supported by eight twohinged, rigid steel frames constructed by Bethlehem Steel. Then considered the largest of their kind in the world, each spanned 235 feet. Bethlehem Steel's logo is still visible from the third floor concourse.

Comparable in size to Madison Square Garden in New York, the arena has seen many decades of wear. Origi-

nal exterior frieze panels recently crumbled, however a surviving panel which was replaced in the 1980s will be displayed at the Farm Show.

Says Emily, "I always thought the primary product of a bee farm is honey, but Fisher's primary product is pollination for them. Honey and bees wax are just byproducts."







Lindsey Kline will get to the meat of the matter with Beaver Creek Angus in East Berlin, and the PA Beef Council. Lindsey says, "I never realized how labor-intensive beef farming is. I give a lot of credit to the beef farmers in PA!" Chelsie Bomgardner and Pennsylvania Livestock Association Past President Mike Firestine will add their beefy insights, and Garrett Kaltenbach will bring some pork to the protein on our plates, joining the PA Pork Producers Council to shed some light on the critical importance of biosecurity in hog barns.

Ask **Anna Houser**, who joined the **Pennsylvania Cooperative Potato Growers** to build on her stores of knowledge gained during years competing in 4-H potato judging. Anna will reveal what she learned about how "**Spud Bot**" technology helps improve potato farming, and how a harvester operator sorts rocks and dirt from potatoes.

Charley Lengel Kramer will put some fruit on our plates, sharing his orchard insights on wide variety of Pennsylvania apples, and their unique qualities that serve different markets and consumer preferences. "I learned the best times to trim trees, how growers use different planting methods to stagger ripening, so harvests are spread out over time."





For added greens and floral flair, Brynn Karnes, who owns and operates her own floral business, toured popular Farm Show exhibitor River Road Produce and Garden Center in Marietta, with Owner Wes Gerber. "The standout theme of the tour was clear: dedication is the cornerstone of success," Brynn said. 



'Er thought about bringing home the bacon? The Farm Show Junior Lire stock Sale provides the opportunity to take home meat raised right here in the Keystone State.

4-H and FFA members work hard for a year or more, to prepare to show their market live stock over the three days at the beginning of the PA Farm Show. Their work purchasing, raising, training, clipping, and showing their market animals has all led to the minute they bring their animal to the auction block at the sale on Tuesday, at n. 13 at 9:30 a.m. in the Small Arena. Bidders support these youth, who then invest the money in their education or their herds and flocks.

#### Why buy an animal at the Junior Livestock Sale?

- Cheaper than purchasing meat at the store.
- Knowing where your food comes from and who raised it.
- Supporting the next generation of agriculturalists and agriculture promoters.

#### Before you seek the winning bid:

#### Do you have enough freeze r space?

(Here's how much meat to expect!)

•Steer: 450-500 pounds of beef

•Hog: 120-150 pounds of pork (bacon, sausage, ham)

•Sheep: 40-55 pounds of lamb

•Goat: 35 pounds of meat

•Rabbit (sold by pen): 3-4 pounds each

#### Do you have a preferred butcher shop?

- If so, let them k ow you'd like them to handle hare sting and fabrication of an animal you hope to purchase at the Farm Show. If not, contact your county Penn State Extension office for help locating a shop. If you are purchasing a hog: all hogs must go directly to harvest with preapproval of trucking and harvest facilities.
- If you don't have a live stock trailer, your butcher shop, or the exhibitor you plan to purchase from, may be able to help you find a hauler.


